Professor Inayath Khsn's father is one who has a unique hame and fame among those who are specialists in singing "Dhrupad." Beyond and above what the Professor has inherited from such distinguished muscians with herited from such distinguished muscians with whom he is connected by ties internal and pater nal, he had the benefit of systmatic course of training in the theory and practice of Indian music in all its branches for over 12 years under Professor Monia Box bimself. Professor under Professor Monia Box himself. Professor Inayulth Khan, who is yet a young man, has already won several Medals and appreciations from Nawabs, Maha Rajahs and Rajahs such as H. H. The Nizam of Hydrabad, H. H. The Geakwar of Baroda, H. U. The Maharajah of Mysore and others for his high proficiency in singing and playing "Beena" and 'Jalatarang'. Unlike many of the Indian muscians Professor Inayath Khan has made a critical study Inayath Khan has made a critical study of the Standard works on "Sangeet' and is also the author of some good books in Hindi on the same subject. He is a very pious man and his songs, particularly those

in praise of god, are very inspiring.
